New Business:

<u>Daniel Wishart-Transportation Manager – presentation district bussing</u>

- ASD-W is currently short 4-5 buses as well as short drivers
- Vacancies in mechanics at DTI which is leading to delays in bus MVI's and each bus has to be inspected twice a year
- A bus delay or cancellation is decided based on whether a bus route can be covered within 2.5 hours of the original time
- A big issue for bus driver retention is wage and hours
- The district is attempting to notify parents earlier about cancellations
- Currently, 258 school bus routes making around 930 bus runs
- Individual bus drivers can decide to cancel their routes if they feel the conditions are dangerous this has just been an option for drivers in 2024-2025 school year
- A review of busing policy did indicate the district is required to provide busing for students living more than 2.4 KM from the school or 1.5 KM from a side street. This policy is not applied evenly across the province but followed in Fredericton.

School Plan-Positive Student Behavior

PLC of specialist teachers (group of teachers review student behavior data, student wellness survey data etc) to further provide proactive initiatives to build student engagement and foster more positive school behaviors.
